

Using the Map of Medicine

Find a pathway by browsing by clinical area

1. Select **Browse pathways by area** in the top panel.

Browse pathways by area

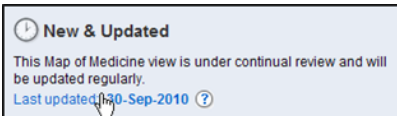
2. In the **Browse pathways by area** pane, select a department title link to see the specialties it contains.
3. Select a specialty title link to see the pathways it contains.
4. Select a pathway title link to see the pages it contains.

Local pathways in the view have a local pathway icon next to the pathway or page name.

5. Select the page title link to go to the pathway page that you want to view.

Find a new or recently updated pathway

1. On the Map of Medicine home page, select the **Last updated** link under the **New & Updated** section. The **New & Updated** page appears.



2. Scroll to the bottom of the page to the list of pathways with links to the new and updated pathways and publisher's notes.
3. Roll over the information icon to view publisher's notes about why a pathway was added or updated in the current release.
4. Select the pathway title link for the new or updated pathway that you want to view. The pathway opens in a new browser window or a new tab in the current browser window at the new or updated page.

What is a view in the Map of Medicine?

All clinical content in the Map of Medicine is available through specific **views**. A view contains all of the Map's pathways, some of which may have been customised to reflect the actual practices or resources available in a local healthcare community. A local view is named after the healthcare community that publishes it.

Change to another available view of the Map of Medicine

1. To see which views, other than your default local view and the International view, that you have access to in Map of Medicine, select the **Other views** link at the top of any page.

2. Select the view name link for the view that you want to change to.
3. In the dialog box that asks you to confirm that you want to change views, click **OK**.

Map of Medicine changes your current view to the one you selected. The name of this view now appears at the top of every page.

Repeat this process to change back to your local view.

Find a pathway page that you recently viewed

1. Select **View recent pathways** in the top panel.

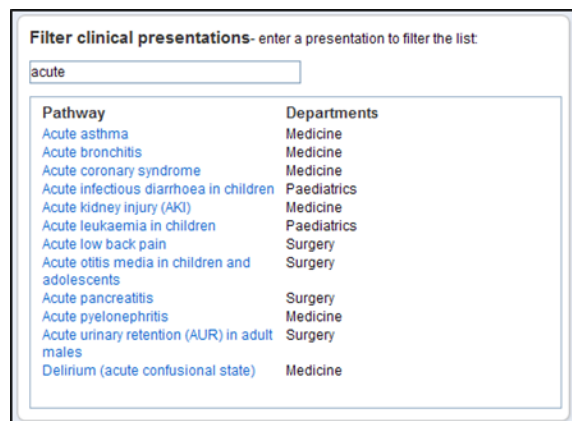
View recent pages

View recent pathways becomes the active pane in the top panel. It displays the list of up to 20 pathway pages that you have viewed recently, in reverse chronological order.

2. In the **View recent pathways** pane, select the page title link for the pathway page that you want to view. The pathway page appears with the top node highlighted.

Find a pathway page using the clinical presentations filter

1. In the **Filter clinical presentation** panel at the bottom of the home page, type a term describing a clinical presentation.



Map of Medicine performs an interactive search of all pathway titles for the clinical presentation term, progressively narrowing the results until you stop typing.

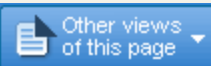
2. In the list of pathways that meet your clinical presentation criteria, select the pathway title link for the pathway that you want to view.

The pathway opens at its first page (usually the one with **[start here]** in the title).

Using the Map of Medicine

View the local version of this page from another view

1. Click **Other views of this page** in the pathway page title bar.



A dialog box lists other views with local versions of the page.

- Local versions of pages have clinical content that is different from the information available in the versions of the page available your local view and in the International view.

2. Select the link for the view where you want to see the local version of the pathway.
3. In the dialog box asking you to confirm that you want to change to the selected view, click **OK**.

The local version of the pathway from the selected view appears.

- You must change back to your local view to see pathways from your local area.

View the supporting information associated with a node

1. On the pathway page, select the node that you want to view supporting information for. The node's **Quick info panel** expands at the right of the page.
2. If necessary, use the scroll bar to read all of the supporting information for the node in the **Quick info** tab.

View the national information for a node

1. On the pathway page, select a node with national information, indicated by a **National info** icon: . The node's **Quick info** panel expands at the right of the page.
2. Select the **National info** tab to display the national information that is relevant to the current step in the care journey.

View the local administrative information for a node

1. On the pathway page, select a node with local administrative information, indicated by a **Local info** icon: . The node's **Quick info** panel expands at the right of the page.
2. Select the **Local info** tab to display the local information that is relevant to the current step in the care journey.

Print a pathway page

1. Click **Print page** in the pathway page title bar.



If you have added personal notes to the pathway page, a menu appears allowing you to select whether you want to print the pathway page with or without your notes.

2. Select the appropriate link. The pathway page opens as a PDF file in a new browser window.
3. From the **File** menu, select **Print**.
4. Configure your print selections.
5. Click **OK**. The pathway page prints on your selected printer.

View the pathway's Evidence or Provenance certificate

You can view the Evidence certificate or Provenance certificate for the pathway in one of two ways:

- Select the **Provenance** link at the top right of the pathway page.

- Select the **View provenance for this pathway** link at the bottom right of the pathway page.

The pathway's Evidence certificate or Provenance certificate opens in a new browser window.

Add a personal note to a node

1. Select the node that you want to add a personal note to. The node's **Quick info** panel expands at the right of the page.
2. Select the **Notes** tab.
3. Type your note in the text field, ensuring that you do not include any information that could be used to identify a specific patient.
4. Select the **Save note** link. The **Quick info** panel updates and shows your personal note in the **Notes** tab. The node now has a **Note** icon indicating that there is a personal note associated with it.

Submit feedback about a pathway

1. At the top of the pathway page, click the **Give feedback** button. The **Feedback** panel expands from the top of the page.
2. Type a subject line for your feedback.
 - The Feedback Reviewer will see the **Subject** text in the list of feedback received from your view, so make sure that your subject line is as specific as possible.
3. Type your feedback in the **Comments** field. Include as much information as possible so that Map of Medicine can act on your clinical feedback about the pathway.
 - When you submit your feedback, the record will automatically include a field indicating which pathway and node you are submitting feedback about.
4. Click **Submit**.
5. If you are not in your local view, a dialog box will appear indicating that you will have to return to this view to review any responses to your feedback. Click **OK**. The **Feedback** panel updates with a message thanking you for your comments and informing you that you will be notified once your comments have been reviewed.
6. Click **Close** or wait a few seconds. The feedback panel collapses and returns you to the regular page view.
